"THE ROLE OF LABOUR ORGANISATIONS IN THE GREEN DEAL"

CONTEXT AND AIM

In the autumn of 2019, the Von Der Leyen committee presented the Green Deal. Its objective is to 'transform the EU into a fair and prosperous society, with a modern, resource-efficient and competitive economy where there are no net emissions of greenhouse gases anymore in 2050 and where economic growth is decoupled from resource use'. The corona crisis has also once again demonstrated that we will have to relate to our planet in a different way.

Workers' organizations can play an important role in the realization of the Deal. We will have to ensure that achieving objectives is always accompanied by social justice. But it is also important that workers' organizations are aware of the content and importance of this Deal. After all, the Green Deal wants to focus on 'protecting the health and well-being of citizens from environment-related risks and impacts. At the same time, this transition must be just and inclusive.' These are also key core values of workers' organizations.



In order to achieve a circular economy, certain jobs will disappear and others will be created. It is important that decent work is essential in these new jobs.

Social dialogue also has a role to play in the Green Deal. For example, the Climate Pact will build on exchange within the social dialogue committees. In addition, the Deal recognizes the importance - for companies and their workers - of social dialogue actively helping to anticipate and successfully manage change. In order for this social dialogue to run smoothly, it is important that the labour organizations are well informed about the theme: what role can labour organizations play in carrying out the Green Deal?'. The environmental change must always go hand in hand with social justice. We must always be aware of the strong regional differences within the EU. It is therefore important that there is good exchange between the labour organizations of the different regions within the EU. This way, better-supported positions can be reached.

Both the academical as the practical side of the story will be brought to attention.
